Early drop/ after school

At TIS, parents have the possibility of dropping their children from 07h45 in the morning and collecting their children at 17h10. Alert Attentat-Intrusion and natural disasters

All schools in France are required by law to evaluate potential risks to the school and its children and staff and to carry out a Plan Particulier de Mise en Sureté (PPMS). This document is available in school for consultation by parents but serves as a working reference for staff on-site to know the procedures put in place for managing crises. Attached with this letter is an information sheet that describes what to do in the case of major accidents.

In addition, schools are required to plan for situations when there is an intrusion. This is part of the "Plan Vigipirate" put in place nationally in France. Parents need to consult the information on the notice boards at the school to keep abreast of the current levels of alert.
